

Conkers General Site for Educational Visits Risk Assessment

The following risk assessment is devised to control safety measures implemented on site. It is the responsibility of school staff to ensure that all our safety measures are met and introductory instructions are followed for safety reasons.

School staff are also responsible for supervision of children at break times and when working in small groups. You must have a list of children in your care and arrange meeting points should anyone lose their way. A site plan will be issued to you.

The risks below will be marked as Low, Medium and High risk areas

Exhibit Hall / Enchanted Forest / Treetop Walk (Discovery) Slip, trip or fall	M	Please report any issues to the Reception staff in respect of broken or damaged equipment or spillages. The Enchanted Forest is not recommended for children under 4years of age. 4D Cinema	L	3D and 4D effects can cause distress to some children – Bookings for EYFS / Year 1 will are subject to a pre-visit. Not suitable for epilepsy or migraines sufferers. Children should always stay in their groups and use the pathways and pavements when transferring to and from the coach park. At the Waterside site - Children should be dropped off by the coach outside of the Main Entrance. Coaches should park appropriately across the outer car parking bays. Care should be taken when transferring from the main building back to the coach and children should be closely supervised during this time.	Children must be supervised by group leaders at all times.

Be mindful that you will be sharing the pathway with runners, cyclists and dog walkers (loose dogs). Children should be discouraged from talking to members of the public and from petting dogs. Children are discouraged from putting their hands near their faces or in their mouths throughout this activity. Children should wash their hands after this activity especially before eating. AVOID areas of excess nettles / brambles Not recommended for children under 8years of age Long hair to be tied back out of the way. Children to stand away from / back from smoking fires. Children should adhere to the safe practices as instructed by the Ranger. Children should wash their hands after this activity especially before eating. The fire lighting element of this activity may be cancelled as a result of prolonged hot / dry weather.
